Herzl and the Single Mother

While Vikki Knafo was making her way by foot from Mitzpeh Ramon to Jerusalem a few months ago, launching a grassroots protest against drastic cuts in welfare payments, those of another stratum of Israeli society were busy organizing a festive evening at the Jerusalem Theater, launching

a year of activities marking the I 00th anniversary of the death of Theodor Herzl. I was present at the event, and found it to be an opportunity to reflect on what the Zionist visionary might have said to those of us in the auditorium about all that was going on just outside the doors.

It is now several months since a group of single mothers set up camp outside the Knesset, protesting the Government's economic reforms that made their financial plight unbearable. Headlines in the daily newspapers bemoan the growing violence among Israeli youth. Reports of corruption at every level of our public and corporate institutions have become so routine that they barely elicit more than a shrug. Traders in flesh have found a haven within our borders. Foreign workers are taken advantage of. And this past summer our national pride took another beating when an international study divulged that our educational standards were embarrassingly low — shortly after the release of other statistics revealing that the gap between the "haves" and the

statistics revealing that the gap between the "haves" and the "have-nots" in Israel is among the largest in the developed world. If Mayor Dizengoff indeed responded with satisfaction to reports of prostitution in Tel Aviv, noting that at last we had become a normal people, imagine how pleased he would be today!

Herzl, on the other hand, would not be. Shortly before his death in 1904, he declared "I truly believe that even after we possess our land, the land of Israel, Zionism will not cease to be an ideal. For Zionism as I understand it includes not only the yearning for a plot of promised land legally acquired for our weary people, but also the yearning for ethical and spiritual fulfillment." As obsessed as he was by finding a political and territorial solution to the Jewish problem, he was always driven by the opportunity that this solution would provide for fashioning an ideal social order as portrayed in his utopian novel Altneuland.

Herzl, of course, was not alone in his dreaming. Creating a *chevrat* mofet – an exemplary society – was always integral to the Zionist dream. And that, I believe, is what Herzl would want to remind us of as we prepare to honor his memory on the centenary of his passing.

To those who challenge the continued relevance of Zionism today, this is the answer. The homeland has been attained. Jews from around the world have been brought home, and the doors of immigration remain open. But the challenge of engaging Jews

FRANCE

Aware of the large number of enthusiastic French tourists in Israel this summer, Dr. Robert Zbili, President of the **French Zionist Federation**, proposed organizing special Zionist day trips for them during August.

The Zionist Federation undertook promotion of the venture in France, while the Department for Zionist Activities worked with UNIFAN (The Association of Olim from France and North Africa) and *Tnu'at Aliyah* of the *Aliyah* Department to turn the idea into reality. More than 300 tourists left the beaches of Netanya and Ashdod, with hundreds more flooding the phone lines to try to get on to the tours, and came to Jerusalem for guided visits to Mount Herzl, the Kotel, and the Hebrew University. The highlight of the day for the tourists was having the opportunity to meet and mingle with recent olim from France, who shared with them their experiences and answered questions.

The tremendous success of this pilot project was above and beyond our expectations and has led the French Zionist Federation and the Department to look forward to expanding this exciting new program of Zionist Day Tours next summer.

CHILE

The Zionist Federation in Santiago succeeded in finding a unique way to convey to the people of Chile the important message that Jerusalem is, and shall forever remain the capital of the State of Israel. And they did so from within the official residence of the country's president. On August 21st, Mr. Roberto Munoz, President of the

Together with the discussion groups in Moscow and St. Petersburg, this project has attracted over 100 Jewish intellectuals to engage in serious deliberations regarding subjects such as modern Zionism and Israel-Diaspora relations.

UKRAINE

The Zionist organization in the Ukraine reports that in carrying out scores of projects (more details in the next newsletter), it has succeeded in raising fully one third of its budget for 2003 from local donors. Its greatest success in eliciting local financial support was for its 2003 summer camp, called 'Shorashim', with 180 youngsters, and financed 50% by JAFI and 50% by local donors.

DOR HEMSHECH LEADERSHIP TRAINING

Responding to the ongoing need of Zionist Federations all over the world to cultivate cadres of young adults (aged 30-45) who

would be willing to expand Zionist Federation activities and community presence, the Department for Zionist Activities is launching a new *Dor Hemshech* leadership initiative.

Building on the successes of regional conferences in North America, Latin America, and Europe, the Department is launching six-month local training programs, culminating with a week in Israel. Groups of 20-30 participants are forming in Budapest, Marseilles-Nice, Buenos Aires, and Santiago, the venues chosen for the first stage of this pilot project. In each case, the local Zionist Federation is taking charge of the program, heading a local steering committee (to include appropriate community leaders) and helping to choose lecturers and workshop leaders under the auspices and guidelines of a professional Jerusalem-based coordinator.

The program will include the following components:

- Strengthening Jewish/Zionist identity
- Selected issues in contemporary Israel
- Israel-Diaspora relations, with emphasis on the specific country
- Leadership and management skills
- A personal Zionist hands-on project to be undertaken by each participant through the local Zionist Federation.

Recruitment began early this fall. The various courses will begin in mid-December.

Upon the completion of these four pilot projects, the Department intends to use the experience gained to build a comprehensive package for Dor Hemshech leadership programs that will be offered exclusively to Zionist Federations all over the world.

ZIONIST CARAVAN IN FRANCE

The Department for Zionist Activities, with the cooperation of the Aliyah Department of the Jewish Agency and the Zionist Federation in France, organized a Zionist Caravan to encourage aliyah throughout France. The caravan, which took place in July, visited the large Jewish communities in the suburbs of Paris: Issy les Moulineaux, Sarcelles, Garges, Choisy le Roi, Boulogne, Les Lilas, St. Brice, La Courneuve, and Creteil. They were received enthusiastically by all. The caravan included a picture exhibition of Israel, a film about the first 50 years of the State of Israel, and a lecture entitled "From Oslo to the Road Map," given by Lieutenant-Colonel Olivia Rapovitz, the head of the Aliyah Delegation in Europe-France. A performance by five singers from Chavat Hanoar Hazioni in Jerusalem closed each visit.

HERZL ON THE MOVE

Innovative and modern in its conception, the exhibition will connect Herzl's life, times, and vision to the reality of the Zionist State as it has emerged, and it will present intellectual and conceptual challenges for the future. The exhibit will include programming materials for educational use.

The exhibition will be available in the major languages spoken by Jewish communities around the world and will be offered to lewish communities through the exclusive auspices of the local Zionist Federation.



"The quality and interactive nature of the exhibit will stimulate a renewed interest in the Zionist idea and the architect of the Jewish state," says Breakstone. "It will also serve the Zionist Federations in their ongoing efforts to ensure that Zionist ideology continues to impact on the agenda of the Jewish communities around the world."
